History

Jacksonport was one of the main mustering points for the Confederate army in Arkansas. Throughout the war both armies contended for possession of this strategic port located at the center of the White and Black river trade. The Confederate attack on Helena was planned here in 1863 by Generals Sterling Price and Theophilus H. Holmes.

At various times Jacksonport was headquarters for such noted military leaders as Frederick Steele, Earl Van Dorn, John S. Marmaduke, Dandridge McRae and Jo Shelby.

The confederate Memorial Monument was erected in 1914 in honor of the confederate soldiers who fought in the Civil War from Jackson County. It remained on display in Newport until May of 1973 when it was damaged by a storm. It was then repaired and moved to Jacksonport in November of 1973.

The Jackson Guards were organized at Jacksonport, Jackson County, Arkansas, by Captain A.C. Pickett, a prominent lawyer, of Jacksonport, Sunday morning May 5th, 1861. The Company was marched to the Presbyterian Church and there presented with a beautiful silk flag made by the fair ladies of Jacksonport. The presentation speech was made by Miss Mary Tom Caldwell, assisted by Miss Pauling Hudson, and Miss Fannie Board. The speech of acceptance was made by Private S.S. Gause of the Company. They were then marched to the steamboat Mary Patterson and with Capt. Morgan Bateman, the owner and commander, they took passage for Memphis, Tenn. and from there went to Richmond, Va. –their destination at that time.
