



Superintendent of Newport Schools, Mr. Castleberry has served in this capacity for two years; under his able administration the schools of the district have made rapid progress.







HISTORICAL DATA AND PROGRESS OF NEWPORT HIGH SCHOOL

The events and persons featuring in the development of the school, are given to you from the memory of this writer, and thru consulting a few of the older citizens.

Newport Grade School was established in the year 1883. For a number of years the sessions were held in the churches. St. Paul and First Baptist. Mr. Pickney, Principal.

In 1901 the school was moved to Main street. Rev. S. A. Mosley, Principal. The early leadership was under a number of persons namely, Mr. Scott, Mr. Robie, in 1906. In 1917 Mr. Wheeler, Mr. Howard, 1918. Mr. C. A. Gettis, whose administration was highlighted by a number of progressive changes. There were six teachers on the staff at this time. Under his supervision the eighth grade was added.

In 1922 Mr. Harrison succeeded Mr. Gettis. In 1923 Mr. Gregg, who was president of the school board at that time and had been for some time contending for a new building, was successful in having the present brick building erected.

In 1925 Prof. W. F. Branch was elected Principal. There were a number of teachers during the time added to the staff who did a tremendous job. The Parent Teacher Assiocation was organized, the boys shop was built, the Home Ec. Building, in 1928 was added. Mr. Branch raised the standing of the school from the eighth grade to the tenth and finally to the twelfth. During the twenty-three (23) years as Principal he did much for the school and the community.


In 1948 Mr. Branch was succeeded by the present principal, Mr. C. B. Craft. Mr. Craft has a B. S. Degree from A. M. & N. College and a M. S. Degree from the University of Arkansas.

Under the leadership of Mr. Craft a building program of approximately \$90,000 has been completed, \$2,000 in improvements have been added to the Home Ec. Department, it is equal to any in the state. An athletic field east of the school has been purchased, Audo-Visual Aid has been added. A new building program has been started for the erection of a \$75,000 Elementary School Building.

There are now fourteen teachers on the faculty. Mr. Craft and his staff have striven to raise the standards of the school and the community, to the extent that its quality of production and standards of performance, together with its physical plant, will merit a class "A" rating in the near future.

Having given to you my humble but earnest accounting of the events in the history of this school of yesterday, I gladly pass the task of recounting the progress of the school under the present administration to some younger and more comprehending mind, who can give you in a more colorful manner the description of this very faculty, improvements made in the physical property of the school, the outstanding records of our athletic teams, our new gym, the hot lunch project, and last but not least, the deep appreciation we have for our present president of the school board Mr. J. N. Hout, who has manifested his interest in helping us make a decent approach to normal standards in our school.




The Ground Breaking Ceremony for the new \$75,000 elementary school was held Friday, January 30, 1953.




Mother Parks, oldest citizen, says "Good Morning" at the Ground Breaking.






