





#### PHILOSOPHY OF SCHOOL

I. The school is that institution of learning which enables its students to live happier and do more as a result of instilling within them those qualities that will fit them for life's service.

#### II. Aim of School:

To produce healthy, happy, and useful citizens.

#### III. Objectives of School:

- 1. To guide the child's interest and curiosity through the most desirable channels.
- 2. To create within each child a sense of responsibility.
- 3. To thwart the results of erroneous ideas by replacing them with facts and truth.
- 4. To provide recreational activities so that the child may dispose of his energy in the most wholesome way.
- 5. To stimulate interest in group participation.
- 6. To create an atmosphere in the school so that the child will enjoy coming to school.
- 7. To create an appreciation for an interest in aesthetics.
- 8. To make the child conscious of the fact that the world has a place for everybody and to prepare him for that place in the world.

#### IV. Curriculum of the School:

The curriculum of the school should be standard enough to include those courses which will be useful to him today as well as tomorrow. It should be flexible enough to change with the times.

- 1. It should include those courses which enable students to pursue further training.
- 2. It should include those courses which will allow its students to take their places in the community as citizens directly after high school.
- 3. It should be broad enough to include each student's interest as an individual.
- 4. It should be modern enough to meet the demand of a changing world.
- 5. It should be void of those courses or subjects which have been declared archaic or obsolete.
- 6. It should include courses which will help students (or assist) them in their successful passage from childhood to adolsecence, and from adolescence to adulthood.
- 7. It should include those courses which will help in the solving of problems which the student will face in his immediate surrounding.
- 8. It should include those activities which promote individual development or talents.

#### V. Students of the School:


The students of the school should manifest and interest in and a determination to get the most out of his school career.

- 1. The student should develop a sense of curiosity toward learning the most he can.
- 2. He should not be wasteful of his school time.
- He should strive to receive the most from each of his courses although his interest in the courses may vary.
- 4. He should feel free to seek advice from his teachers concerning problems he confronts.
- 5. His attitude toward learning should be one of curiosity and satisfaction rather than pessimistic and nonchalant.


